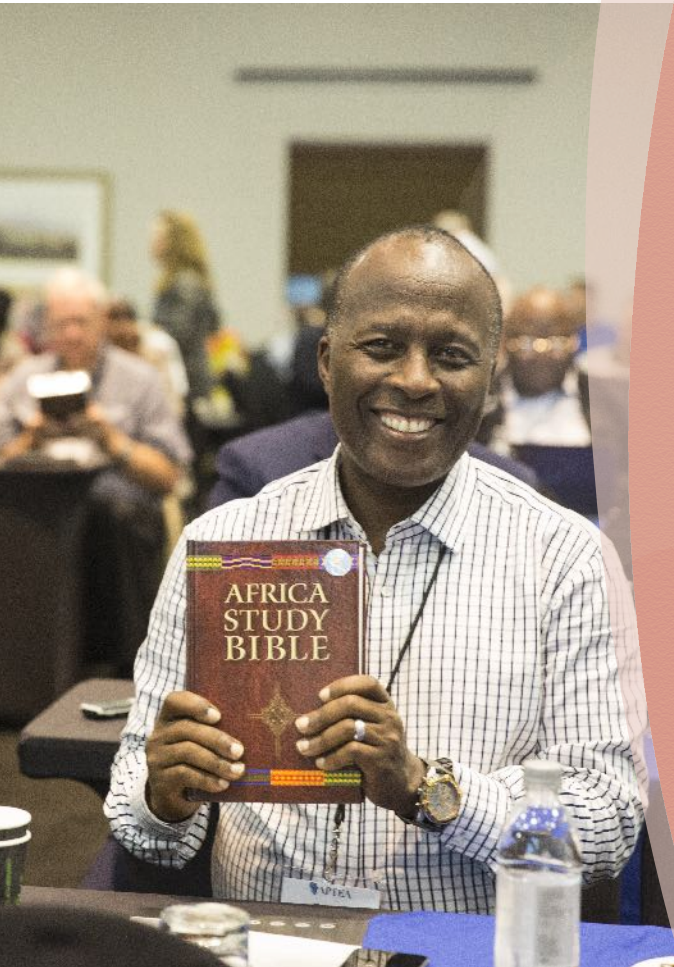

The Commission provides training opportunities for on-site evaluators and self-study facilitators at various sites across Africa. The Commission also provides documents and materials to member institutions to facilitate the process of endorsement and accreditation.

APTEA promotes close working relationships and sharing of resources among Pentecostal theological institutions throughout Africa.
